Our Rabbi Reflects



From Rejoicing to Renewal

Snow is falling as I am writing about the coming of spring, but that only helps me anticipate the coming of our Jewish spring holidays, Purim (March 11-12) and Passover (Pesach – April 10-18). Purim brings with it the assurance that, despite outward appearances and gloomy prospects, G-d is working behind the scenes to help us, but only if we act to help ourselves. Pesach every year marks the renewal of our covenant with G-d, as we reenact the departure from Egyptian bondage and the journey toward both spiritual and national freedom.

Freedom is only meaningful, however, if we use it to counter the Hamans and Pharaohs of the world and to fight for freedom for all who are persecuted. The most repeated commandment in Torah is to not wrong the stranger (46 times!) because we ourselves were strangers in the Land of Egypt. Is it any wonder then that Jews have always been involved in movements to aid immigrants and society's downtrodden? The command to do so is written indelibly in our Torah and is thus part of our DNA. Purim represents the hidden miracles, while Pesach celebrates the miraculous made manifest. In both stories, however, the human element is essential.

The Purim imperative to become so joyous (read "drunk") as to not be able to distinguish between Haman and Mordechai is countered with the very sober instruction to open our doors to let the hungry come in and eat at the Pesach seder. Yet both holidays are also a celebration of salvation – from genocide in Persia as told by *megillat Esther* (the scroll of Esther), and from slavery in Mitzrayim (Egypt) as told in Exodus. We are therefore obligated by that very salvation to help, as much as we can, in the salvation of others. When we do, both our rejoicing and our renewal take on the highest meaning.

Message from Our Presidents



Neil's Natterings

Terry Pluto, a columnist for the *Cleveland Plain Dealer*, has two pages in the Sunday Sports section called simply, "Terry's Talking" – very nice and alliterative. However, have you ever tried to alliterate the name Neil? Actually, Francie isn't very easy either; thus, in our next bulletin, the President's column will be entitled "Francie's Fussings."

- ◆ **Flood and Fire:** For those who have not yet heard, on January 12 we had a torrential downpour that overwhelmed the storm sewer on Glenwood and caused back-up into our basement of about 18 inches of water. This resulted in burning out our sump pump and also flooding our boiler and hot water tank. When the water level rose above the burners in our boiler, it caused the flame to move upward and created a fire within the boiler. The resulting smoke set off our alarm system and resulted in the fire department, police, the electric company, and two gas companies sending people to our site. The boiler has been temporarily fixed, and we do not know how long it will hold. Since parts are no longer available for this unit, we are now entertaining replacement bids. The cellar has been cleaned out and an anti-fungal treatment has been applied. Insurance is covering the repairs.
- ◆ As you will read elsewhere in the bulletin we have formed a social action committee (see story on page 6). There has been some discussion with members on this. We have had some feedback as to whether this is a proper function of a shul. We maintain that the idea of a social action committee is not only a function of a shul but totally in keeping with Jewish ethics and tradition. If you have any thoughts on this subject, please send us them for our new comments section of the bulletin.
- ◆ **Coming Events:** On March 3, we will be having a Friday night Kabbalat Shabbat Service at the Birch Hill Cabin in Mill Creek Park at 5:30. It will be a potluck dinner. On Sunday, March 19, at 2:00 pm, we will be running the film *Flory's Flame* with light refreshments being served. Our Purim celebration will take place March 20 at El Emeth at 4:30. Sunday, March 26, will feature a Stained Glass Concert: the Youngstown Symphony Orchestra will perform at El Emeth at 2 pm. Finally, on March 28 at 6:00 pm, the Rosh Chodesh Women's group will meet (location TBD).
- ◆ For April, plans so far include a Kiddush sponsored in honor of Shirley Kessler's 95th Birthday on April 8th, followed three days later by our annual second night Seder. OTSAC: Ohev Tzedek Social Action Committee

On February 5, Ohev Tzedek Temple took the first steps to creating a social action committee to be called OTSAC. The kick-off meeting featured a screening of the movie *Before the Flood*, a documentary on global warming produced and narrated by Leonardo DiCaprio. The film was followed by a presentation by Dr. Colleen McLean, a biology professor at YSU specializing in environmental recovery.

However, raising environmental awareness is only one facet of what the committee is looking to accomplish. The idea is to take steps to help develop our community, some that we are already taking (such as volunteering at Second Harvest Food Bank) and to begin involvement in other programs where the committee members feel they can make a difference.

Realizing that this is a major task for any small group of people, the committee has decided to join forces with representatives of the wider Jewish community in this endeavor. A meeting was held with representatives of the other area shuls and with the director of the Federation's social action committee, Sarah Wilschek, to start the planning process. Our representative to this meeting was Shari Della Penna, who will be co-chairing OTSAC with Carol Gottesman. Our initial attendance on the 5th was 18 people, of whom 11 indicated that they would like to continue doing things to help the community.

The next meeting will be focused on which directions the committee will take and set priorities in those programs. If you have any ideas for programs or actions that OTSAC can become involved in, and especially if you would like to be involved yourself, please contact the office and let Caitlyn know that you would be willing to attend.

Adult Education

Classes that receive a minimum of six registrants will begin in April. Each is designed to be approximately 10 sessions. Some classes may require a text to be purchased in addition to the registration fee of \$50 per class. Unless otherwise noted, all will be held at Ohev Tzedek. Rabbi Oresky is also open to suggestions for classes not proposed below. All of the classes are open to the entire Jewish community.

- ♦ *Jewish Composers and Musicians from Biblical to Classical to Pop* – A treat for the mind and the ears: we will learn about Jewish composers and musicians from King David to Carole King and listen to and discuss their music. How, if at all, did their Jewishness influence their music? Feel free to suggest composers and musical selections when you register for the class.
- ♦ *What's So Funny About Being Jewish? A Study of Jewish Comedians* – Who doesn't have a favorite Jewish comedian? Why has comedy been a Jewish occupation for so long? How could a people with an often-tragic history produce such a large number of really funny people? We'll watch and listen to comedy routines both old and new and search for common threads.
- ♦ *The Amidah* – Using Rabbi Lawrence Hoffman's excellent volume in the *My People's Prayer Book* series as a guide, we will explore this core prayer to discuss *tefilla*, Jewish prayer, as a whole, and how Jews have ever understood our ongoing, evolving relationship with G-d.
- ♦ *Selected Books of the Prophets: Joshua and Judges* – Read beyond the *haftarot*! By delving deeper into some of the prophetic writings, we'll begin to access the wisdom of this crucial middle third of the Tanakh. We'll start with the first two books that follow the Five Books: what happened once our ancestors entered the Land? Why are these two books so different?
- ♦ *Saying Kaddish* - Using *The Kaddish Minyan* and several other excellent sources and classroom discussion, we will explore "the time after" a loss of a dear one; saying Kaddish can be far more than a rote exercise – it can be a path to reconnection with the past, a meaningful activity of the present, and an important link to the future.

Bias in the Media: Is a Picture Worth 1000 Words?



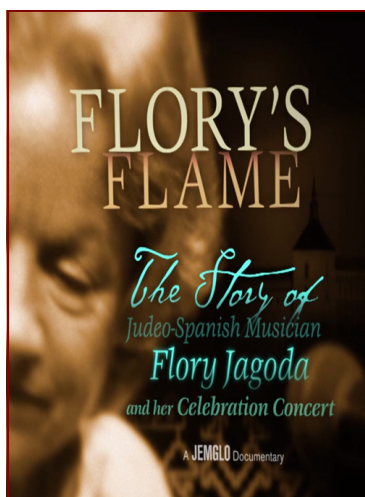
