## Our Rabbi Reflects



### A Springtime Roller-Coaster Ride

I confess to always having been a big fan of May and June; on both the secular and Jewish calendars (this year spanning the Hebrew months of late Nisan to late Sivan), they are months full of meaning, commemoration, and celebration. Even weather-wise, they can be among the most agreeable months of the year. Mood-wise, they offer us a roller coaster ride from lows to highs and back again (be careful if you are susceptible to “emotion sickness”).

This year, we hit a sad and introspective note only five days into May - Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Memorial Day, offers us one day to remember and to try again to deal with one of the most incomprehensible tragedies in our history: the murder of more than six million Jews in Europe by the Nazis and their collaborators. The further in time we get from that horrific time, the more the Shoah moves from accessible memory to amorphous history. As the last generation with first-hand memory of the destruction dies, the risk of Holocaust deniers being believed increases. In every generation, we need to keep the memory of the victims and events of the Shoah alive. When children are old enough to begin to grasp the tragedy, they should be taught about it, carefully and appropriately, not to scare them but to make them aware of what we as a people have suffered and how we have survived (and thrived). While it should never become our main focus or, worse yet, our motivation for survival, the Shoah should nevertheless be given its proper place in our memory.

The very next Sunday brings us both Mother’s Day and Rosh Chodesh Iyar - both causes for celebrating! The coaster climbs...

In the following week, on Yom HaZikaron, however, it’s back to sadness as we remember Israel’s fallen soldiers, those who died defending her. But then, another high point, as we celebrate Israel’s founding on Yom HaAtzma’ut the next day. I don’t want to imagine where we would be as a people today had Israel not achieved independence and begun her miraculous defiance of all odds to remain alive and free for these past 68 years. We mustn’t forget that, despite the problems we might have at times with her government, we rely on Israel more than she relies on us.

### BUILDING A BRIDGE TO TOMORROW

In formally establishing the Ohev Tzedek-Shaarei Torah Congregation Endowment Fund in 1995, synagogue executive leadership went on record as having stated their “belief that the financial strength of the Synagogue will be enhanced by the establishment of this receptacle for financial support that will advance the cause of our beloved Temple.”

The 'Fund' was established in order to . . .

- A. provide funds for capital improvements on synagogue owned property for updating and improvement of existing facilities and for the acquisition of additional or replacement equipment and other objects necessary for the operation of the Synagogue;
- B. Provide operational funds supplementary to dues and financial contributions in order to insure the highest level of ongoing religious, educational, cultural, social and charitable activities.
- C. Serve as an emergency source of operating revenue in the event of an unusual drop in Synagogue operating income.

Through expert management of the Jewish Federation's financial consultants—as well as local management—the corpus of our fund has both grown and is being tapped more regularly than ever when expenses have to be met. This is the reality of operating a synagogue in the current climate where “affiliation” here and elsewhere is on the wane.

### YOUR PERSONAL LEGACY—OUR OBLIGATION

Do you want a viable Congregation Ohev Tzedek when you are gone or no longer to actively participate? I do. I mean, this is why I agreed to serve as President. ### REMINDER

Lag B'omer, the 33<sup>rd</sup> day of *sefirat ha-omer*, the counting of the *omer*, is celebrated on May 26 (the 18<sup>th</sup> of Iyar), providing us the opportunity to take a breather from this traditional period of mourning by celebrating with picnics and other outings. It's good to remember that even in the midst of periods of darkness, light can break through. While we might find it difficult to mourn as tradition dictates during the *sefirah*, counting off the days between Pesach and Shavuot is a mitzvah that we can observe in other ways. One popular way is to use a kabbalistic *omer* counter that attaches meaning to each day of the *sefirah* by mapping it onto the *sefirot*, the Divine emanations. The *sefirah* marks our people's passage from liberation (on Passover) to revelation (on Shavuot) – saying the blessing and doing the count is a meaningful way to mark that passage.

After Lag B'omer, the next weekend through Monday brings us our national holiday of Memorial Day, when, sadly, the time to remember our fallen among the American armed forces often gets lost in sales, barbecues, and simple enjoyment of the late spring weather. Is our Memorial Day, then, a low or a high on the roller coaster ride? Perhaps it is a bit of both, but isn't that like much of Jewish experience as well?

June 5 brings us Yom Yerushalayim, when we celebrate the reunification of Jerusalem; those of us old enough to remember the photos of the Israeli soldiers emotionally rejoicing to have recaptured the Old City during the fierce fighting of the Six Day War of 1967 understand how important Jerusalem is in the hearts of the Jewish people.

Rosh Chodesh Sivan follows soon after, and on the 6<sup>th</sup> of that month, we celebrate Shavuot, the pilgrimage festival on which we also celebrate the giving of the Torah on Mt. Sinai. Whether we understand Revelation to be Divine or human or something combining both, we can all rejoice that we have the Torah and that it has been our treasure, our core teaching, and our unifying force for almost our entire existence as a people. “*Etz chayim hee lamachazikim ba* – it (the Torah) is a tree of life to those who cling to it strongly” – may we merit being able to do so for all of our lives.

The month coasts to a close with Flag Day and Father's Day (Dads need love, too!), and then we're officially into summer. I hope that these May and June holidays will bring you joy, quiet introspection, and maybe even a little thrill!

## Catching Up With Your Synagogue

#### (That Was The Week That Was)

Upon entering the Kitchen there was a pervasive odor of gas. There was also a faint hint of running water coming from the basement. It was the Monday after a truly wonderful Seder the day before.

We called the gas company who promptly appeared and starting sorting out the gas leaks in the kitchen and in the basement. While in the basement, we discovered that the north wall had water flowing down the side right next to the electrical outlets. This was just before the computer and phones went out.

Sounds like the beginning of a fictional novel, I know, but this was what actually faced us at the Temple and what started a very unusual week.

During the course of the week we discovered and had repaired three gas leaks in the basement, and then an additional one two days later. The Magic Chef stoves in the kitchen also had a leak and while the leak was repaired are now at limited capacity. There were two different water leaks: one on Monday and again at another spot in the basement on Friday and then on Saturday.

The leaks have been fixed, but the problems still exist. This house, our house of worship, is aging.

There are two ways to look at what happened last week. The first is of course how horrible it is that we are having all these problems. The second is that God is watching over us, and this is His way of awakening us to a problem and giving us a chance to make changes before something worse happens. I prefer the latter point of view.

First this did not happen the very night before, when we had over fifty people here and conducted a very moving and enjoyable Seder. Second, it awakened us to multiple problems that could have done real damage. And, finally, there was no real damage done, even though if the water flowing in the basement had been a foot to the west with the gas permeating the air, the shorting of the electrical system could have generated a spark that would have resulted in an explosion.

Whether this was God acting as Shomer to his people, or as some prefer to believe just luck, this is a situation that will require our efforts at Ohev Tzedek to find a more permanent answer than the continual patch-work of repairs as problems arise.

This is our House and we owe it not only to ourselves but to those who built it to do what is necessary to make whatever changes are necessary for the future.

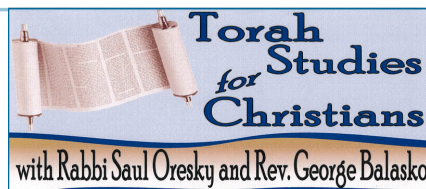
